

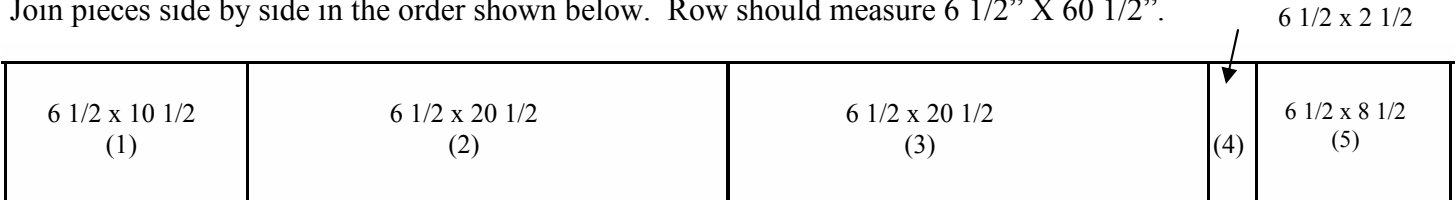
Block Construction:

Sewing Tips: All seam allowances are 1/4" throughout the project. Press seams towards the darker fabric when possible.

After cutting all the required pieces, follow the Color Layout Guide to arrange the pieces for the entire quilt. This will allow you to plan out the color placement of the pieces to insure a pleasing look for the blocks. Once all the pieces are arranged to your liking, separate the pieces in rows as indicated on the Row Diagram. Sew the pieces together into blocks for each row. Refer to the block construction diagrams to assist you in determining how to sew each block together. Then, join the rows together. The numbers in () on each diagram indicate the sewing order of the pieces.

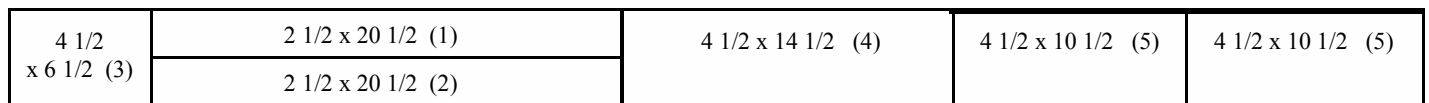
Row 1:

Join pieces side by side in the order shown below. Row should measure 6 1/2" X 60 1/2".

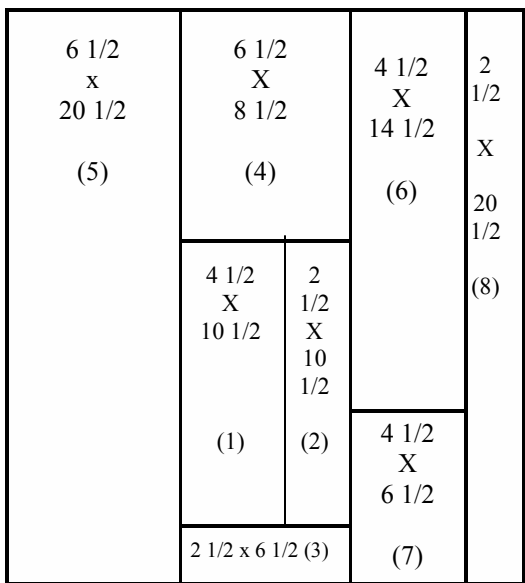


Row 5:

Sew Piece 1 to Piece 2. Sew Piece 3 to the left side of Piece 1-2. Sew Pieces 4, 5 and 6 to the right side of the unit in the order shown. Row should measure 4 1/2" x 60 1/2".



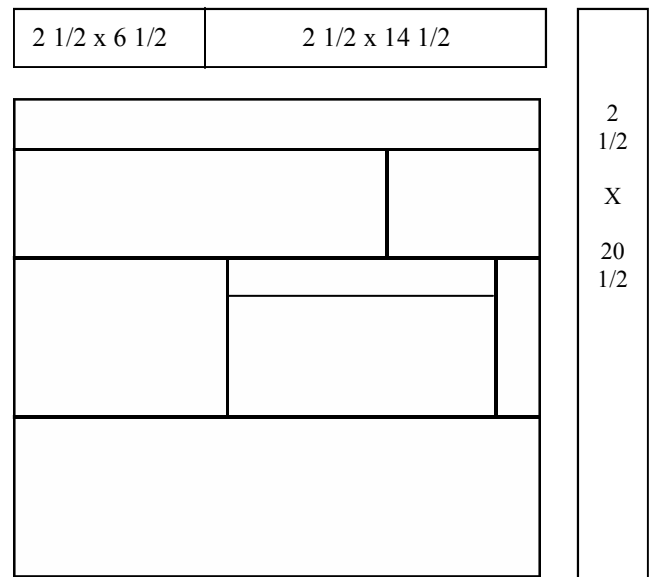
Block A: Make 3 blocks using different fabric combinations.



To assemble block:

- Sew Piece 1 to Piece 2.
- Sew Piece 3 to bottom of 1-2.
- Sew Piece 4 to top of 1-2.
- Sew Piece 5 to left side of 1-2-3-4.
- Sew Piece 6 to Piece 7.
- Sew 6-7 to right side of 1-2-3-4.
- Sew Piece 8 to right side of 6-7.

Block should measure 18 1/2" x 20 1/2". (Make 3)



To ONE of Block A, you will need to add additional pieces. Rotate block as shown above.

- Sew a 2 1/2 x 6 1/2 piece to a 2 1/2 x 14 1/2 as shown.
- Sew to top of Block A.
- Sew a 2 1/2 x 20 1/2 piece to the side of Block A.

Block should now measure 22 1/2 x 20 1/2.
This block will be used in Row 4.

Block B:

Make 3 blocks using different fabric combinations.

To assemble block:

- Sew Piece 1 to Piece 2.
- Sew Piece 3 to right side of Piece 1-2.
- Sew Piece 4 to left side of Piece 1-2.
- Sew Piece 5 to bottom of Piece 1-2-3-4.
- Sew Piece 6 to bottom of Piece 5.
- Sew Piece 7 to bottom of Piece 6.

Blocks should measure $20\frac{1}{2}'' \times 20\frac{1}{2}''$.

Block C:

Make 3 blocks using different fabric combinations.

To assemble block:

- Sew Piece 1 to Piece 2.
- Sew Piece 3 to Piece 4.
- Sew Piece 5 to bottom of Piece 3-4.
- Sew Piece 3-4-5 to right side of Piece 1-2.
- Sew Piece 6 to bottom of Piece 1-2-3-4-5.

Omit Pieces 7 and 8 on ONE block. This block will be used in Row 4. This Block should measure $20\frac{1}{2}'' \times 18\frac{1}{2}''$. For TWO of the blocks, sew Piece 7 to bottom of Piece 6. Sew Piece 8 to right side of block. These Blocks should measure $20\frac{1}{2}'' \times 22\frac{1}{2}''$.

Borders:

The quilt center should measure $60\frac{1}{2}'' \times 70\frac{1}{2}''$. Due to individual sewing differences, your measurements may vary from this size. Be sure to measure your quilt before cutting the borders.

Cut 8 strips $5\frac{1}{2}''$ wide. Piece 2 strips together for each side.

Measure the length of the quilt. (Our quilt measured $70\frac{1}{2}''$). Cut two borders to this measurement.

Mark the center of the border strip. Mark the center of the length of the quilt. Pin border right sides together with quilt, matching center points and ends. Sew to sides of quilt

Measure width of quilt. (Our quilt measured $70\frac{1}{2}''$) Cut two borders to this measurement. Mark the center of the border strip. Mark the center of the width of the quilt. Pin border right sides together with quilt, matching center points and ends. Sew to sides of quilt. This finished quilt size should measure $70\frac{1}{2}'' \times 80\frac{1}{2}''$.

Quilt as desired.

Binding: Cut 8 strips $2\frac{1}{2}''$ wide for binding. Sew the strips together end to end. Bind, mitering corners.
